

# Incoming mediations

#### Statistical projection

March 2011 – December 2022



- From 13 December 2012 to 30 September 2013 the compulsory attempt at conciliation was suspended;
- In 2012 there were approximately 45.000 mediations (an average of 11.165 per quarter) for damages from circulation of vehicles and boats, this subject matter is no longer mandatory as of September 20, 2013

The comparison of incoming and resolved mediations 2022 with those of 2021 shows, respectively, a decrease of about 7% and 11%. The decrease is partly accountable to a resumption of judicial activity after the Codiv-19 pandemic that has led to a partial recovery of the incoming and resolved cases not made during 2020. Comparing 2022 incoming and resolved mediations with those of 2019 shows respectively, an increase of 5%, and a decrease of about 3%, which means that incoming mediation are growing, and their large number of post-pandemic received in 2021 could not be met.

### Data by subject matter: focus on insurance contracts

Incoming mediations for insurance disputes decreased at all bodies ("outlier" -29% e "no oulier" - 18%).

Also for this type of proceedings, the decrease is partly accountable to a resumption of judicial activity after the Codiv-19 pandemic that has led to a partial recovery of the incoming and resolved cases not made during 2020.

Comparing 2022 incoming mediations with those of 2019 shows a significant decrease at the "outlier" bodies (-34%), while, for the incoming at the "no oulier" bodies, no change is detected. The increase, noted in the previous periods, due to the Supreme Court's ruling No. 19596/2020 of 09/18/2020, seems to be attenuating.



In 2022, incoming mediations related to the COVID containment measures were 4.449, equal to 3% of the total.







# Rate of Counterparty Participation in a Mediation Process




### Trend of success rates






# Success rate by Type of Referral


### Categories of mediation – resolved cases








# Lawyer's assistance in voluntary mediation




From September 21<sup>st</sup> 2013 the assistance of parties by lawyers is mandatory for all mandatory mediations
